
WORK PROGRAM COST SHARES

Committee Procedures

The Coordinating Council consists of a permanent seat for each local government entity designated as a Phase I MS4 by the Texas Pollution Discharge Elimination System (TPDES), and three representatives from each of the four major watersheds in the combined urbanized areas of North Central Texas. The four major watersheds are divisions of the Upper Trinity River and are known as the Mainstem, West Fork, Elm Fork, and East Fork, see **Figure 1**.

If a community or entity exists outside of these divisions they will be represented within the Mainstem watershed.

TCEQ REGULATORY UPDATE



HB 1902: Graywater and Alternative Onsite Water Reuse

The TCEQ is developing standards similar to those that exist for graywater for additional water sources you may re-use (alternative on-site water). Sources include rainwater, air-conditioning condensate, foundation drain water, storm water, cooling tower blowdown, swimming pool backwash and drain water, reverse osmosis reject water, or other sources of water that the TCEQ deems appropriate



NCTCOG staff working with monitoring entities to determine number of watersheds and number of locations in each watershed that will be monitored in the next Permit Term.

NCTCOG will be sending draft Proposal out to entities for review and comment. After edits are made, the Proposal will be sent to TCEQ.
