- Total Budget
 - Total Project: \$36,378,756
 - DOE Funds: \$13,181,171
 - Cost Share: \$23,197,585
- 22 projects were pre-identified in an open process prior to submittal of an application to DOE
- Project package:
 - 284 light-, medium-, and heavy-duty vehicles
 - 11 refueling sites



- Original scope of work
 - 28 CNG shuttle buses
 - Federal share: \$520,117
 - Cost share: \$1,665,440
 - All buses deployed between December 2009 and March 2010
- New scope
 - 9 CNG sedans, 1 CNG van
 - Federal share: \$63,028
 - Cost share: \$218,627
- Total project will displace over 12 million gallons of petroleum



- Marketing and Outreach
 - Hosts events and workshops
 - Displays decals on all AFVs/ATVs
 - Regularly gives presentations
- SECO ARRA Funding
 - 13 CNG transit buses, 37 CNG shuttle buses and 2 CNG sweepers
 - Award: \$904,400



- About the Airport
 - 4th busiest airport, serving 57 million passengers per year
 - Over 500 AFVs
 - Three on-site public-access CNG refueling stations
 - Electric vehicle charging stations
 - Displaces almost 2M gallons of petroleum annually
 - Fleets reduces 557 tons of NOx annually
 - Partners with airlines to implement zero-emissions ground service equipment
 - Drill on-site for natural gas
 - Numerous awards
